BITS AND PIECES By Mark Hurley

While everyone has been pretty much sequestered at home *ad infinitum*, the theatre organ continues to make news near and far:

- The historic Atlanta Fox Theatre's 1929 M.P. Möller (Opus 5566) organ's original console has now returned to the Fabulous Fox. The A.E. Schlueter Organ Company of Lithonia, Georgia, has done a magnificent job of restoring the console to absolutely better than new condition. Want to see and hear it? Simply go to WWW.YOUTUBE.COM on the Internet. Type in "A Very Merry Mighty Mo Homecoming" in YouTube's search engine. You should then be taken to the page featuring the inimitable Ken Double at the console of "Mighty Mo" for a special program that celebrates the organ's 91st birthday. There are also several videos featuring Maestro Double and the organ. Enjoy!
- Interested in some classical/church pipe organ videos? Go the New York City Chapter of the American Guild of Organists' website at www.NYCAGO.ORG home page to hear see and hear some of New York's City's magnificent church

organs. These include two Cathedrals: the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine (Aeolian-Skinner Organ Company), Saint Patrick's Cathedral (George Kilgen and Son) and Saint Thomas Episcopal Church (Dobson Pipe Organs, Ltd.). The Dobson was completed in late 2018. Whilst you are there, look for the NYC Organ Project links on the left side of the NYC AGO homepage. It's a veritable treasure trove database of many, many organs in New York City's five boroughs. All kinds of pipe organs can be found there, including New York's movie theatres.

- Frank Vanaman reports that his "new" Walker Technical Company/Devtronix four-manual organ is playing merrily in his home. Frank had Bob Walker, the company's namesake, visit to do some "tweaking" of the instrument to better suit its new home. Maybe we'll get invited to explore the organ, once we are hopefully past the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 5 Organist Mark Herman has been busy posting videos as well of various theatre organs (including Bandrika Studios) on YouTubeSM. Go to WWW.YOUTUBE.COM and type in "Mark Herman Organist." You will be delighted with Mr. Herman's artistry. Bandrika Studios' organ may not be a familiar name but its sound may well be. The organ once belonged to Twentieth Century Fox Studios. If you've seen these movies such as The Day the Earth Stood Still, The Sound of Music, The Witches of Eastwick, Journey to the Center of the Earth and most recently, The House with the Clock in Its Walls, then you've heard this organ. Wurlitzer built three nearly identical three manual "specials" for these studios: Paramount (Opus 2035), Warner Brothers (Opus 2022) and Fox (Opus 2967). The Warner Brothers organ was once owned by actor Joseph Kearns (Mr. Wilson in the Dennis the Menace TV sitcom) and is now in the Renaissance Theatre, Mansfield, Ohio. Paramount's was purchased by organ enthusiast Richard Simonton, most of which is now in the Jack Hardman Wurlitzer.
